Key Accomplishments

Helped plan majority of Sunday services and participated as service leader and/or delivered the homily or a special message. BUUF's 2020 Member & Friend Survey revealed that 61% of BUUFers want BUUF's minister to deliver the sermon at least 3 times a month.

Engaged in pastoral outreach on a weekly basis, which included visiting or calling BUUFers in the hospital or long-term care and reaching out to all BUUFers in our directory following the quarantine. Also wrote a series of Letters from the Minister to include in the BUUF Announce.

Provided support as a member of BUUF's Stewardship Team, Membership Team. Sunday Services Team, Caring Team and Soup Kitchen Team. Worked with the Buildings & Grounds team to install new windows and helped provide childcare during monthly Parents Night Out events.
