

Social Justice Committee 2020 Report & FY 2020/2021 Proposal

The Berrien Unitarian Universalist Fellowship, Social Justice Committee (formerly the Community Outreach/Social Action Committee) will fulfill by July 1, 2020 the previous proposed donations to selected recipients (same as below). We had one meeting in person on 2/2/20 and one via ZOOM on 5/26/20. We did not hold any social justice events. We hope to hold or partner a social justice event, perhaps relating to the U.S election 2020.

The funds available from the BUUF Restricted Endowment accounts for the upcoming FY 2020/2021 Social Justice projects are \$2000. An additional \$500 for Soup Kitchen will be donated from outside the BUUF community. The Committee recommends the following:

- Renewal of membership in the [Michigan Unitarian Universalist Social Justice Network](#). The network informs BUUF of important issues and events in Michigan via newsletter — \$100
- Donation to the [CARES](#) Program in Benton Harbor. CARES provides links and services to HIV positive individuals who are currently out of the medical care network in Berrien County. The mission of CARES is to maximize the quality of life for those affected with HIV/AIDS and to minimize the spread of the disease. CARES provides testing, comprehensive care plans and routine medical services for the 330 plus Berrien County residents who are living with HIV — \$250.
- Continued support of the [OutCenter](#). The funds will be used to support the OutCenter's valuable LGBTQ advocacy programs — \$350.
- Continued support of the [All God's Children Youth Choir](#) to assist with transportation and meals to facilitate the choir's participation in concerts and events — \$200.
- Contribution to the [Safe Shelter](#) for Domestic Violence in Benton Harbor. The shelter provides a secure, violence-free environment for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault and their dependent children. Survivors are offered a protective, warm and violence-free place to stay, support groups and other resources to develop safe, healthy and meaningful lives for themselves and their children- \$300.
- Purchase of food to be prepared for or at the Benton Harbor [Soup Kitchen](#) during BUUF's assigned dates - \$200 and \$500 in donations to be obtained from interested persons [outside of the BUUF community](#)=\$700.
- Contribution to [Saint Augustine's Episcopal Church's Neighborhood Food Pantry](#), located in Benton Harbor - \$100.
- Contribution of time and money to the [Fresh Start Children's Garden](#) in Benton Harbor. The volunteer community garden is at the corner of May and Pearl Streets and seeks to educate and involve the children of Benton Harbor through gardening as food production. The garden project is directed by Emma Kinnard. The BUUF Green Sanctuary team has decided to partner with the 11-year-old project as a demonstration of environmental justice in action - \$100.
- Contribution to [Calling All Colors](#) program in Benton Harbor. The program aims to bring together children for educational and multicultural experiences - \$200.
- Provide funds to the [BUUF Welcoming Committee](#) to hold a workshop to educate and recertify our UUA Welcoming Congregation status - \$200. Welcoming comm. Requests that we will carry over \$200 from FY19/20.

The above Social Justice program donations will total \$2500 (including donations totaling \$500 to meet Soup Kitchen meal preparation obligations). Thank you for your consideration of this proposal.
